

MONARCH JUNIOR BUTTERFLIES

Monarch's Junior Butterflies program is designed for skiers or snowboarders ages 5-6. The program consists of four, one hour and forty five minute sessions on Fridays. Instructors will work with a small group of students to explore the sport of skiing and help instill an enthusiasm for the winter play environment. This program is unique in that it is really a working relationship between the students, the parents, and the instructor. A parent will need to attend and participate each day of the session. This will allow us to ride the lift and explore more of the mountain. Throughout the program in addition to focusing and developing the child's skills the instructor will coach parents in terrain selection, lift procedures and successful facilitation of their child's skiing and riding experience.

POLICIES:

Refunds: Monarch does not offer refunds or make-ups for missed program days. If a student does miss a program day for any reason they will be eligible for a half price two hour private.

Weather: There are no make-up days for bad weather, including snow, cold or wind. Severe winter weather is a likely possibility on all program days. Please plan accordingly and make decisions best for your family's situation. For tips on proper winter dressing please see the information below.

Season Pass: This program comes with a complimentary Monarch Season Pass. If you have already purchased a season pass prior to enrolling your student, a refund will be issued in the amount of the purchased price of the pass.

WHAT TO EXPECT and PROGRAM INFORMATION

First day:

- Please meet Monarch's staff at The Monarch Children's Center
- Arrive at 1:45pm. The first fifteen minutes will be used to check-in students and create lesson groups. Lessons will go to the hill at 2:00pm.
- Participants must be dressed and ready to ski
- Children must use the restroom before lessons
- Lessons end at 3:45pm.

We want our programs to be fun, with no pressure, and reasonable expectations. We will do our best to meet the individual needs of each child and group them in the appropriate classes based on age and ability. Instructors will work with students to explore the sport of skiing and help instill an enthusiasm for the winter play environment. We will play a lot of games and take rest and bathroom breaks as needed. Some class time may occur inside due to weather or other considerations. During these times instructors will facilitate the students' comfort with equipment and train muscle memory through indoor

What to wear:

Your child should wear warm layers of clothing under a waterproof jacket and pants. Students should wear warm waterproof mittens, a warm hat and one pair of warm socks. Wool or synthetic clothing is preferable to cotton garments as cotton absorbs water and does not hold body heat. Goggles and a helmet are also strongly recommended.

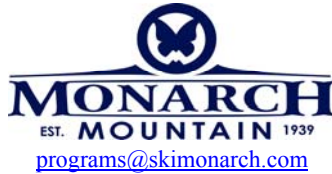
Equipment:

**SKI SCHOOL WARNING, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE OF LIABILITY & INDEMNIFICATION
AGREEMENT**

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING. THIS IS A RELEASE OF LIABILITY & WAIVER OF CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS.

1. The person who is participating in Ski School and or Children's Center programs shall be referred to hereinafter as "Student". The "Undersigned" means only the Student when the Student is age 18 or older OR it means both the Student and the Student's parent or legal guardian when the Student is under the age of 18. The Undersigned agree and understand that taking part in ski school, skiing, snowboarding and using ski area facilities, including the lifts, for any purpose including childcare (hereinafter the "Activity"), can be **HAZARDOUS AND INVOLVES THE RISK OF PHYSICAL INJURY AND/OR DEATH.**

2. The Undersigned are advised that a person using any of the facilities of the ski area is considered a skier. The Undersigned acknowledge and understand the dangers and risks of skiing and understand that the Student, as a "skier" under Colorado law, **ASSUMES ALL INHERENT DANGERS AND RISKS** as provided by the Colorado Ski Safety Act (hereinafter "Act").

3. The Undersigned further understand and agree that in signing this Agreement, the Undersigned are expressly **acknowledging and assuming additional risks and dangers that may result in property damage, physical injury and/or death above and beyond those outlined in the Act, including but not limited to:**

Falling; drills; exercises; free skiing; following the direction of the instructor; terrain selection of the instructor; avalanches; cornices; suffocation; crevasses; equipment failure; equipment malfunction; equipment damage; Student's improper use of equipment; Student's use of his/her own personal equipment; interaction with other students; snow play, taking field trips by walking or by use of ski area or public transportation; playing, eating and/or sleeping in a childcare environment; Student's failure to maintain or otherwise upkeep his/her own personal equipment; slick or uneven surfaces; slipping; tripping; loss of balance; rugged mountainous terrain; bumps; tree wells; downed timber; rocks of various sizes; holes; debris; marked and unmarked obstacles; drainage channels; varying visibility; unmaintained trails; path and/or trail obstructions; unmarked roads and/or trails; Student or another acting in a negligent manner that may cause and/or contribute to injury to Student or others, such as selecting terrain that exceeds his/her ability and not acting within such ability; Student's failure to comply with signage; collisions with natural or man-made objects or collisions with other people; falling objects; encounters with snowmobiles and/or other motor vehicles; becoming lost or separated; lack of shelter; lift loading, unloading, and riding; storms, lightning, hail, snow and other adverse weather; limited access to and/or delay of medical attention; Student's health condition; strenuous activity; fatigue; exhaustion; dehydration; hypothermia; high elevation; altitude sickness; frostbite; & mental distress from exposure to any of the above.

4. Pursuant to Colorado law, Student assumes the responsibility of maintaining control at all times while engaging in the Activity. Student is responsible for reading, understanding and complying with all signage, including instructions on use of lifts. Student must have the physical dexterity and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload the lifts. Student assumes the risks of riding the lifts and engaging in activities accessible from the lifts. Further, the Undersigned understand that a minor Student may use the ski lifts without an adult present. The Undersigned are advised that snowmobiles, snowmaking, and snow-grooming equipment may be encountered at any time, and the Undersigned recognize that falls and collisions occur and injuries are a common and ordinary occurrence of the Activity.

5. The Undersigned acknowledge and understand that the description of the risks listed above are not complete and that participating in the Activity, whether or not described, may be dangerous and may also include risks which are inherent and/or which cannot be reasonably avoided without changing the nature of the Activity. By signing this document, the Undersigned recognize that property loss, injury, serious injury and death are all possible while participating in the Activity. **RECOGNIZING THE RISKS AND DANGERS, THE UNDERSIGNED UNDERSTAND THE NATURE OF THE ACTIVITY AND VOLUNTARILY CHOOSE FOR STUDENT TO PARTICIPATE IN AND EXPRESSLY ASSUME ALL RISKS AND DANGERS OF THE ACTIVITY, WHETHER OR NOT DESCRIBED ABOVE, KNOWN OR UNKNOWN, INHERENT OR OTHERWISE.**
